## **Origin: UN** General Assembly Resolution A/C.2/61/L.16/Rev.1 of 4 December 2006.

- A consolidating document containing:
- 1.Recollection of various Declarations of Rio de Janeiro, Johannesburg and Monterrey (Mexico);
- 2. Reaffirms other internationally agreed development plans, including the MDGs;
- 3. To carry out the policy decisions on practical measures and options to quicken implementation of commitments in water, sanitation and human settlements as stated in the 13<sup>th</sup> Session of the Commission on Sustainable Development (CSD 13)



 A. Recommends joint actions by all States (at national and local levels), UN agencies, regional and international organizations and other stakeholders to cooperate in the agreement to carry out the International Year of Sanitation in 2008.



### The International Decade for Action: Water for Life 2005-2015

#### **Primary goal:**

- to promote efforts to fulfill international commitments made on water and water-related issues by 2015.
- to intensify advocacy efforts and action on the ground.

#### **Commitments:**

 to meet the targets to reduce by half the proportion of people without access to safe drinking water and basic sanitation by 2015.

#### **Gender Balancing necessary**

A special emphasis is placed to ensure the involvement of women in the development efforts for water and sanitation!





## **Rationale for IYS**

#### **Ensure proper sanitation:**

 2.6 billion people do not have access to any sort of basic sanitation facilities;

#### **Disease prevention**

• Millions, especially children, suffer from preventable illnesses, such as diarrhoea, which claim thousands of lives each day.



# **Goals of IYS**

- Raise general awareness;
- Accelerate progress towards the MDG target;
- Reduce by half, proportion of people without basic sanitation by Year 2015





## **Importance of Sanitation**

- 1. It is the foundation of health, dignity and development;
- 2. It is fundamental to reaching the target set in the Millennium Development Goals

# Encourage demand driven, sustainable & traditional solutions

- Pilot demonstration and best practices for sanitation;
- Explore and expand the Private Sector's role in marketing sanitation at Country level;
- Decision model for selection of appropriate sanitation systems.





#### **Secure increased financing**

- Establishment of a sanitation and hygiene Trust Fund and a small grant programme;
- Budgeting for Sanitation How to actually cost sanitation;
- Cost-benefit analysis of sanitation options.



# Develop and strengthen institutional and human capacity

- Strengthening countries' capacity in the safe use of waste water;
- Sanitation in Emergencies;
- National and regional workshops and training courses on sanitation;
- Capacity building workshop of water utilities in Latin America;
- Assess impact of Sanitation interventions on other MDG's.





#### **Enhance the sustainability**

- Development and promotion of integrated sanitation management (ISM) concept;
- Compendium of Publications (technical guidelines);
- Publication on Improved Child Friendly Technologies for Schools and Emergencies.





#### **Promote and capture learning**

- Workshop on linkages between improved sanitation and girls' education;
